“ Lillie Thomas was born in 2002 and went to a family who really did not care for her properly; however, in 2003 she was found in an elementary school playground, lost and begging for the students' snacks because she was so hungry. She was also pregnant (possibly by her male littermate) with many puppies and Lillie was less than one year old in 2003. A kind teacher took her to the nearest veterinarian clinic, which is how I found out about her. I adopted her immediately and had to wait to take her home after her puppies were aborted (the vet did this as he said if the father of the puppies was a large dog, Lillie would likely die trying to give birth). A sad decision, but necessary, and she was also updated on shots and spayed. A lot for a little female puppy to go through. I had Lillie for 13 wonderful years. She was called a bottle rocket by my adult children because she absolutely flew around the privacy fence in my 1/2 acre back yard, and if one of us called to her, she flew to the back door in a second, jumped to the top half of the recliner, and looked around as if she were the Queen of the place, and she was indeed a queen She was an alpha, and our other dog didn't cross Lillie. She ruled, but she was so much fun, and so much joy, so her rule was appropriate and very entertaining most of the time. Her "little" brother, Zach, an 85 pound Malinois search dog, outweighed Lillie by 50 lbs, and towered over so much that she could walk under and around Zach without making any contact with his body. But, Zach deferred to her always. Lillie died from complications of Cushing Disease and from a cancerous tumor, removed in 2000 or so, but it came back with a vengeance a few months ago. She was to go to her veterinarian on the early morning that she died, January 20, 2016. to schedule surgery for the tumor. She died at home, peacefully in her favorite spot, very close to me at 6:30 AM or so. I loved her, still do, and will never, ever forget my "Lillie Pie". She was my girl, and I miss her so much.
